- WHY:** As part of [Armory Arts Week](#), New Yorkers will have a rare opportunity to go behind-the-scenes and see works-in-progress by some of the city's most exciting emerging artists and writers. This one-day special event allows the public to meet a wide range of artists and writers working in a variety of media, including sculpture, video, performance art, playwriting, and poetry before the artists open up their studios for one last time during the culminating *Workspace: Open Studio Weekend* taking place May 13-15. Highlights include works-in-progress by artists such as [Olek](#), whose remarkable crochet public installations have transformed people, bikes, and buildings into works of art, and [caraballo-farman](#), whose larger-than-life visual installations have taken over billboards and stadiums around the world.

The artists are all participating in LMCC's *Workspace*, a nine-month studio residency program. Since its launch in 1997, *Workspace* has established itself as one of New York City's premiere breeding grounds for new artists and writers, including Sanford Biggers, Beth Campbell, and LaToya Ruby Frazier.
